What do you want autism research to focus on?

What is happening?

In 2019, the AARC identified the top 10 areas for Australian autism researchers to focus on. In 2021, focus groups were held about 5 of these areas. This identified the specific questions that research needs to focus on to benefit the autistic and autism communities. They are now investigating the other five areas. These are:

- making built environments more accessible
- choice in housing and living
- health, disability and education services
- family and carer support
- gender, diversity and inclusion
